# PARISH NEWSLETTER & HOME WORSHIP SUPPLEMENT Fourth Sunday of Advent, 20th December 2020

#### Dear Parishioners,

What a joy it was to have the Nambucca District Band entertain many of the Holy Trinity congregation, and some visitors, with Christmas Carols last Sunday. And so good to be able to sing the carols a little.

A further blessing and delight for myself and Sue Noble this last week was to be able to present a short concert of Carols and the Christmas story to many pupils from the Macksville Public School SRE classes on Tuesday. We were able to do this despite COVID-19 preventing us from having SRE classes during most of 2020.

Traditional Christmas carols are a way of expressing what otherwise is a great mystery to us through doxology – a liturgical praise of God. At this time of year, we join the 'multitude of the heavenly host' singing "glory to God in the Highest". Glorifying God is the point of proclamation and the basis of Christian spirituality.



Mary resorted to doxology as she rejoiced after her visit to Elizabeth. She understands that her child will play a key role in God's redemption. Pauls ends his letter to the

Romans with a summary of salvation history and doxology. I look forward to Lesle's homily in Holy Trinity this Sunday and trust that equally uplifting homilies/reflections will be spoken in St Johns and St James'.

Today is the beginning of a historic period in the life of the Anglican Parish in our Valley. This weekly message is the last that I write as Rector of the Parish of Macksville. On 31 December, the Anglican Parish of Macksville and the Anglican Parish of Nambucca Heads will cease to exist. On 1 January 2021, the Anglican Parish of Nambucca Valley will come into being.

An Interim Parish Council consisting of the current Wardens and Treasurers from both parishes will administer the new Parish until the AGM scheduled for 21 February 2021.

We are in a good position administratively for the amalgamation of the two parishes and I expect the transition to go relatively smoothly. Undoubtedly, there will be issues to resolve as we then commence setting up the new model of ministry (Model 1) and in implementing change throughout all worship centres. Nevertheless, along with Mary and Paul, and those faithful parishioners who worshipped in this Valley before us, we can look to the future with confidence and anticipation for what God has for the Anglican Church in the Nambucca Valley.

Most worshippers have now returned to Sunday or Wednesday worship in all of the Valley centres. I believe that the COVID-19 situation has eased to the point that we will be able to commence using a common pew sheet in all worship centres in 2021. Therefore, I anticipate that this will be the last of the Sunday Supplements emailed to Macksville parishioners.

I will still need to keep you well informed on the developments in establishing the new Parish and the new Model, so the pew sheet may contain much more information – like a newsletter. However, it will not contain home worship material.

We will continue, <u>upon request</u>, to email a copy of the pew sheet to parishioners who are unable to join with us on Sundays or Wednesday. We will also email home worship material <u>upon request</u> – however this may change from the form that each parish had during the COVID-19 restrictions. Please contact Sam or Jenny in the Parish office if you wish to receive this material.

After some leave, I will look forward to joining with you again on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2021 as the first Rector of the Anglican Parish of Nambucca Valley. Meanwhile, our able team of LLMs will care for the Parish and Rev Ron Spindler will join us part time commencing 2<sup>nd</sup> January. While in the Parish Ron (and his wife Crystal when she is able to visit) will reside in the Nambucca Heads Rectory.

It is appropriate on our last Sunday service for 2020, and the last Sunday service for the Parishes of Macksville and Nambucca Heads that I end with the doxology that is the second reading for today:

Now to God who is able to establish you by (his) gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery hidden for long ages, but now revealed, and made known through the prophetic writings by the command of the eternal God, so that all nations might believe and obey him — to the only wise God be glory forever through Jesus Christ! Amen. (Rom 16:25-27, NIV)

I wish you a blessed and merry Christmas and a happy new year.

# Reflection on Luke 1:26-38 – Thanks Lesle Cropp Attitude of Discipleship: Trust

#### **Key Verse:**

"Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word"

Luke 1.38

#### Where have you placed your trust this morning?

Confidence that your car will get you to your destination safely? Trust that your family are all okay no matter how distant they are from you? Faith that the worship this morning will honour God and draw you into his love?

But would you "trust" the appearance of God's angelic messenger Gabriel with news of a world-changing request?

Over the four weeks of Advent, we have been exploring attitudes of disciples – hopefulness, preparedness, expectancy and today, we examine trust.

## What does it mean to trust God as a faithful disciple?

Trust is a journey – a journey of faith.

Adopting a trusting demeanour is a direct pathway to God. In trust, those very human behaviours that undermine our dependence on God are deliberately buffeted away in favour of

greater faith-filled actions.

The Trust Journey is like coming out of darkness into the Light.

To counter fear, we are hopeful;

to balance boastful knowledge, we are prepared and repentant;

to apportion life experience, we remain expectant of God's grace;

to rely totally on God, we are trusting and obedient.

Before being able to confidently declare,

"Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Luke 1.38

Mary traversed each of these steps in her encounter with God's messenger, Gabriel.

#### Fear

Fear is Mary's initial response. She is greatly troubled by Gabriel's greeting. This encounter is a most uncommon occurrence and causes much trepidation within her. God acknowledged Mary's fear. He spoke her name and offered her reassurance through Gabriel's encouraging words,

"Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God." (v30)

Fear can rise up within us also when we are confronted by the unfamiliar and seemingly impossible. Yet God knows us by name – he understands our fears and insecurities and pours his compassion over us.

#### Knowledge

Knowledge then rules Mary's reaction to the news. Once God's will have been made known to Mary, she questions out of her knowledge of pregnancy and birth -

"How will this be since I am a virgin?" (v34)

Acknowledgement of *God's* all-knowing superiority will balance Mary's incredulity and prepare her for this amazing event.

At times, our understanding can limit rather than expand, the response we make to God's call and the trust we offer him. We can become boastful and blind to alternative perceptions and blinker our view of the way forward. God has the Creator's oversight, the Maker's mindset. The Trust Journey is progressed when we submit to <u>his</u> understandings.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight." Proverbs 3.5-6

Then, trust will become a quiet certainty.

#### Life Experience

Life experience enters next into Mary's Trust Journey as Gabriel shares the news of Elizabeth's pregnancy. Mary's relative is going to have a child in her old age and she was said to be barren. Life circumstances now tell Mary that these foretold events are actually happening. The two women became expectant and confident, trusting God's plan for their lives.

By focusing on God's faithfulness in the past, we too can face crises with confidence rather than with fear and disbelief. Trust involves giving God our future plans.

## Finally,

having been guided through these steps of the Trust Journey by Gabriel, and reassured that there is nothing impossible with God, Mary embraces the call, hands over her complete confidence and dependency on her Lord and arrives at the end destination of her Trust Journey – she wholeheartedly submits to the will of God.

We too can learn from the twists and turns in Mary's journey towards total trust in God. Whenever we are faced with a crisis or a difficult dilemma that threatens to overwhelm us or to cause us to turn away from Jesus, the steps that Mary took can encourage us.

Trust is a gift of God's Spirit. It swells within us as we increase our reliance upon God. It brings us a new perspective to life's problems and challenges. It is essential to our service in God's plan for the world.

At times, our trust in God is offered only up to a certain point. Then we go back to the worry spiral and the panic prayers of those who don't truly know God. We get to our wits' end, showing that we have not the slightest confidence in God and his authority over the world.

Trust in God means oneness with God – not breaking away when a crisis arises; not relying on our own understanding but on God's provision and grace.

The Trust Journey involves patience and courage. We place our heartfelt confidence in God, standing firmly on the promises of God. Our journey's end is hopeful, humble anticipation.

Listen deeply to the trust that permeates Mary's prayer, as she says,

"Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Luke 1.38

#### **Closing Prayer**

Come, Lord Jesus. Help us to make Mary's prayer our own so that we go out into your world with an enduring trust in your will for our lives.
